Excluded Pond 1	2.099 acres	(b)(8) Artificial lake/pond constructed or excavated in upland or a non-jurisdictional water, so long as the artificial lake or pond is not an impoundment of a jurisdictional water that meets (c)(6)	Excluded Pond 1 is a manmade pond. The pond is the result of water filling a borrow pit that was excavated wholly out of uplands. Therefore, this office has determined this feature is an excluded water pursuant to (b)(8).
Excluded Wetland 1	0.113 acre	(b)(1) Non-adjacent wetland	This wetland is a closed polygon boundary that is not contiguous or directly abutting an (a)(1)-(a)(3) water. In addition, this wetland does not meet any of the other (a)(4) criteria for adjacency and thus is an excluded water pursuant to (b)(1).
