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Corps investigates flooding in Greenville County

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CHARLESTON, S.C.--- Officials from the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers, Charleston District deployed a response team to Greenville County yesterday to investigate the magnitude of the flooding in and around the City of Greenville, particularly reported flooding on the Reedy River and Langston Creek.

Immediately following the notification of the flooding in the county, Corps officials visited some of the affected sites to assess local damage. This assessment includes the setting of high water marks, review of damages, and the examination of the impacts of the flooding on Corps study sites.

The Corps currently has a flood control study at Brushy Creek, an environmental study at Lake Conestee, and two studies on the Reedy River – an environmental study and a comprehensive watershed study.

Corps official have met with state and local officials as to areas where the Corps could provide federal assistance should the Corps be tasked by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA)
