- **B.** Typical year assessment(s): Antecedent Precipitation Tool (APT) data for typical year determination was calculated based on the field collection date (February 10, 2020) in the report submitted by the consultant. Output from the APT indicated "Wetter than Normal" conditions with a value of 17 during a period of "Moderate wetness" in the Wet Season.
- C. Additional comments to support AJD: The review area covers approximately 0.16 acre and includes one excluded (b)(1) water. Excluded Water (Wetland B) does not meet any of the criteria for adjacency and is an excluded (b)(1) non-adjacent wetland.
