B. Typical year assessment(s): Antecedent Precipitation Tool (APT) data for typical year determination was calculated based on field collection data denoted on the originally included wetland delineation data forms (March 5, 2021). Output from the APT indicated "Wetter than Normal" Conditions at the time of data collection by the agent (Brigman Company) with a value of 18. ATP outputs with a condition value greater than 14 indicate "wetter than normal" conditions, "normal" conditions range from 10-14, and values less than 10 are considered "drier than normal". For this assessment, the APT tool pulled data from 10 weather stations within an approximate radius of 5 miles. Results of the APT indicate the site visit was conducted under conditions considered by the Corps to be outside "typical year". However, APT results being on the wetter end of normal conditions in combination with the geographic positioning of waters and uplands onsite are such that it would not change the jurisdictional status of those features.

C. Additional comments to support AJD: This form addresses 13.84 acres in Murrells Inlet, SC. Present onsite are three excluded waters. The onsite (b)(1) water continues offsite and is a closed boundary polygon that does not abut and is not inundated by an (a)(1)-(3). The two (b)(8) waters onsite were excavated out of uplands. Historical aerial images (1983) show the ponds were excavated out of former farm fields. The project site is a portion of a former golf course. The project boundary is surrounded by residential development on three sides.
