Excluded Water	0.25 acres	(b)(1) Non-adjacent wetland	The onsite wetland does not abut and is not inundated by an (a)(1)-(3) water. Additionally, this wetland is physically separated from an (a)(1)-(3) water by multiple physical, man-made barriers (berms, roads, etc.) Wetland 2 continues offsite to the east where they are physically separated from the nearest (a)(1)-(3) water by a road (SC Highway 544) and a series of ditches and man-made berms (spoil piles). While the continuation of the wetland does drain into the off-site ditch system and storm water drains, the drainage network does not meet the criteria of an (a)(1)-(3) water. Since the wetland does not abut an (a)(1)-(3) water, is not inundated by an (a)(1)-(3) water, and is physically separated by more than a single artificial barrier, they are determined to be non-jurisdictional.

- B. Typical year assessment(s): Antecedent Precipitation Tool (APT) data for typical year determination was calculated based on field collection data denoted on the originally included wetland delineation data forms (August 18, 2020). Output from the APT indicated "Wetter Than Normal Conditions" at the time of data collection by the agent (The Brigman Company) with a value of 18. ATP outputs with a condition value greater than 14 indicate "wetter than normal" conditions, "normal" conditions range from 10-14, and values less than 10 are considered "drier than normal". For this assessment, the APT tool pulled data from 10 weather stations within an approximate radius of 19 miles. Results of the APT indicate the site visit was conducted within conditions considered by the Corps to be outside of a "typical year".
- **C.** Additional comments to support AJD: The area in review contains 4.35 acres and includes a single excluded water. The wetland appears to continue off to the east but is separated from (a)(1-3) waters through multiple artificial barriers.

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
