B. Typical year assessment(s): Antecedent Rainfall Calculator data for typical year determination was calculated based on the field collection date provided by the agent (12 Oct 2020). The Antecedent Rainfall Calculator data showed “wetter than normal” conditions at the time of data collection by the

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agent with a condition value of 15, which indicates that typical year hydrologic conditions were not present. For this assessment, three weather stations, located within a 12-mile radius, were used.

- C. Additional comments to support AJD:** The 1.25 a. review area does not include any jurisdictional or excluded waters. Although the soil survey depicts a portion of the site as Coxville, which is a hydric soil, the information submitted by the agent, including data forms, found no hydric soils present in this area. The NWIs and topographic map depict this site as consisting entirely of uplands with no linear features or potential aquatic resources present. Therefore, this site was determined to consist of uplands.

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
