The on-site non-adjacent Wetland 1 is physically separated from an (a)(1)-(3) water by off-site uplands and numerous impervious manmade barriers (roads, berms, etc.). There is no clear direct or indirect surface connection from the on-site wetlands to an off-site (a)(1)-(3) water. Since the on-site wetlands do not abut an (a)(1)-(3) water, are not inundated by an (a)(1)-(3) water, and are physically separated from jurisdictional waters by uplands, they are determined to be non-jurisdictional.
Excluded Waters 2	0.07 acres	(b)(8) Artificial lake/pond constructed or excavated in upland or a non-jurisdictional water, so long as the artificial lake or pond is not an impoundment of a jurisdictional water that meets (c)(6)	On-site waters do not abut and are not inundated by an (a)(1)-(3) water. The on-site pond was constructed out of non-jurisdictional waters and, therefore, is not jurisdictional Since the on-site pond does not provide surface water recharge to (a)(1)-(3) water, is not inundated by an (a)(1)-(3) water, and is physically separated from jurisdictional waters by uplands and multiple manmade barriers, it is determined to be non-jurisdictional



Typical year assessment(s): Antecedent Precipitation Tool (APT) data for typical year determination was calculated based on field conditions observed on the date of the data forms (July 30, 2020). Output from the APT indicated "wetter than normal" at the time of data collection by the agent with a condition value of 18. For this assessment, a total of 12 weather stations within a ~22 mile radius were used.

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ATP outputs with a condition value of less than 10 indicates "drier than normal" conditions on site, while a condition value of 10 up to 14 indicate "normal" conditions, and a condition value greater than 14 indicates "wetter than normal" conditions on-site. Please note that the site condition value calculated by the APT may, or may not, accurately represent a typical year's hydrologic conditions. The APT should be used in conjunction with other tools and local guidance to assess "normal" climatologic conditions for specific locations.

It should further be noted that conditions were significantly wetter than normal during the period of data collection and the preceding May and June due to tropical weather systems effecting the region during that period; however, this increase in precipitation did not result in a finding of jurisdiction.

B. Additional comments to support AJD:

This 1.85 acre site consisting of flat, cleared and undeveloped, land was analyzed without a site-visit via remote data sources, including: topographic maps, NWI maps, Chesterfield County soil maps, LiDAR digital elevation model (DEM) data, site pictures (supplied with original submittal), and aerials from Google Earth (February 4, 2019), the Charleston Regulatory Viewer tool, and coordination with the applicant's consultant.

After a careful analysis of the aforementioned data sources, this site was found to contain one non-adjacent (non-jurisdictional) wetland meeting the criteria of a (b)(1) exclusion and one non-jurisdictional pond feature meeting the criteria of a (b)(8) exclusion.

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
