- **B.** Typical year assessment(s): A pond or impoundment can be determined an (a)(3) water if the water contributes surface water flow to an (a)(1) in a typical year either directly or indirectly through one or more waters identified as an (a)(2), (a)(3), or (a)(4). A wetland can be determined as an (a)(4) adjacent wetland when an (a)(2) tributary inundates the wetland by flooding in a typical year. However, since the on-site swales are not (a)(2) tributaries, there is no need for a typical year assessment in this review.
- C. Additional comments to support AJD: The review area for this form covers a project area of approximately 43.926 acres. There is one excluded pond and one excluded wetland. The wetland is considered to be excluded and non-adjacent. There are several swales on the site that were evaluated and documented to be non-aquatic resources. They have no OHWM or meet the parameters of a wetland. Additionally, the pond on-site was determined to be excavated in a non-jurisdictional (b)(1) waters and is not subject to regulation under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act.

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
