- B. **Typical year assessment(s):** Antecedent Precipitation Tool (APT) data for the typical year assessment was calculated based on the field collection date denoted on the wetland determination data forms (August 24, 2020). Output from the APT indicated "wetter than normal" conditions at the time of data collection by the agent (The Brigman Company) with a condition value of 16. APT Output with a condition value greater than 14 indicates "wetter than normal" conditions onsite and may not accurately represent typical year hydrologic conditions. For this assessment, a total 4 weather stations within an 18-mile radius were used.
- C. Additional comments to support AJD: There are no open water features, features that exhibit characteristics of a tributary, or areas that meet the three parameters of a wetland located within the project area. The site consists entirely of uplands.
